
H.E. Ahmed Aboul Gheit 8th Secretary-General of the League of Arab States



Ahmed Aboul Gheit joined the diplomatic corps in 1965 after completing university, and rose through the ranks of the Egyptian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, occupying diplomatic positions in Rome, Nicosia, Moscow and New York. He participated in negotiations in 1978 of the Camp David Accords, which led to the signing of the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty. In 1999, he was appointed Permanent Representative of Egypt to the United Nations, before being recalled to Cairo in 2004 to take the lead in diplomacy. He served as the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Egypt from 11 July 2004 to 6 March 2011. In December 2005, he began mediating the Chad-Sudan conflict. Aboul Gheit was elected Secretary-General of the Arab League in March 2016; his term commenced on 3 July 2016.

After studying Oriental Studies (i.e. languages: Arabic, Persian and Turkish history, religion, and the cultural and literary history of the Muslim world) and Classical Philology at the Universities of Freiburg i.Br. and Basel, Udo Steinbach received his doctorate in 1970 as Dr. phil. From 1971 to 1974 he was head of the Middle East Department at the German Institute for International and Security Affairs (SWP) and then for many years (1976 to 2006) director of the German Orient Institute in Hamburg and then founding director of the GIGA Institute for Middle East Studies. From 2007 to 2010, Professor Steinbach taught at the Center for Near and Middle Eastern Studies at the Philipps University in Marburg and from 2012 he headed the Governance Center Middle East / North Africa at the HUMBOLDT-VIADRINA School of Governance, Berlin (later HUMBOLDT-

VIADRINA Governance Platform / Governance Center Middle East - North Africa).
